9th Saipan Marathon Set for April 19, 2014

Saipan, Northern Mariana Islands (NMI) – April 19, 2014, will mark the 9th running of the Saipan Marathon in the Northern Mariana Islands (NMI). The Marathon will again include half-marathon, 10K, and 50K courses, as well.

Early registration for the 50K and marathon is \$55.00 for US and NMI participants, and \$45.00 for half-marathon and 10K participants. Early registration must be made by March 7, 2014. An additional late fee of \$10.00 will apply to registrations submitted after March 7. The last day to register for the event will be on March 14, 2013 at 5:00 p.m. Registration will include the awards banquet, a finishers t-shirt, and a certificate of completion.

The start will take place at the American Memorial Park at 4:30 a.m. for the 50k and the Marathon, at 5:45 a.m. for the half-marathon, and at 6:00 a.m. for the 10K. This year the marathon will implement a cut-off time for both the full marathon and 50K. The cut-off time will be 9 a.m. at the halfway point.

All competitors are required to pick up their race packets on April 18, 2014, at 4 p.m. without exception.
