CHINA'S "HOLIDAY TRAVEL" FILMS IN SAIPAN

Saipan, Northern Mariana Islands (NMI) – “Holiday Travel,” one of the top 10 information and education television program in China’s Shandong province, filming in Saipan this holiday season. The show’s two hosts arrived in Saipan on Dec. 23, along with 12 show guests.

The Northern Mariana Islands of Saipan, Tinian, and Rota are a chain of idyllic islands in the West Pacific, offering a friendly, fun and exciting vacation in paradise. The Northern Marianas are served from Tokyo and Osaka in Japan by Delta and Asiana Airlines. From Korea, Asiana provides direct flights from Seoul and Busan. China is served from Beijing, Shanghai and Guangzhou. Russia is served via Vladivostok and Khabarovsk. United Airlines has daily flight connections from nine cities in Japan to Saipan via Guam.
