“LOVE ISLANDS” FILMS IN SAIPAN, TINIAN

Saipan, Northern Mariana Islands (NMI) – The Chinese television drama “Love Islands” recently filmed in Saipan and Tinian for an episode that will air in February 2015.

“Love Islands,” titled “Bian Shen Hua Mei Nan” in Chinese, consists of Chinese and Korean actors and has 10-million viewers in mainland China.

“The upcoming ad exposure from ‘Love Islands’ is really good for the Northern Marianas, because the sites visited in Saipan and Tinian will become better known to this large audience which will help bring more tourists from both China and Korea,” said Marianas Visitors Authority Marketing Manager Bruce Bateman.

The episode is expected to feature scenes filmed at various tour sites, including Micro Beach, along Beach Rd., Mariana Resort & Spa, T Galleria, and Tinian Dynasty Hotel & Casino. The production team also conducted aerial shooting via helicopter.

“Love Islands” is produced by Beijing Yin He Century Film Company.

The Northern Mariana Islands of Saipan, Tinian, and Rota are a chain of idyllic islands in the West Pacific, offering a friendly, fun and exciting vacation in paradise. They are an excellent destination for families, adventure and sports-minded travelers, as well as business people looking for a tropical haven. Adventurous travelers from Asia, Australia, Europe and elsewhere looking for new travel discoveries will find them in the Mariana Islands, just three hours travel from most cities in Japan, and

four from Asia and Australia. The Northern Marianas are served from Tokyo and Osaka in Japan by Delta and Asiana Airlines. From Korea, Asiana provides direct flights from Seoul and Busan. From China, direct flight service from Shanghai, Beijing, Guangzhou, Tianjin, Hangzhou and Wuhan to Saipan is available. United Airlines has daily flight connections from nine cities in Japan to Saipan with one stop.
